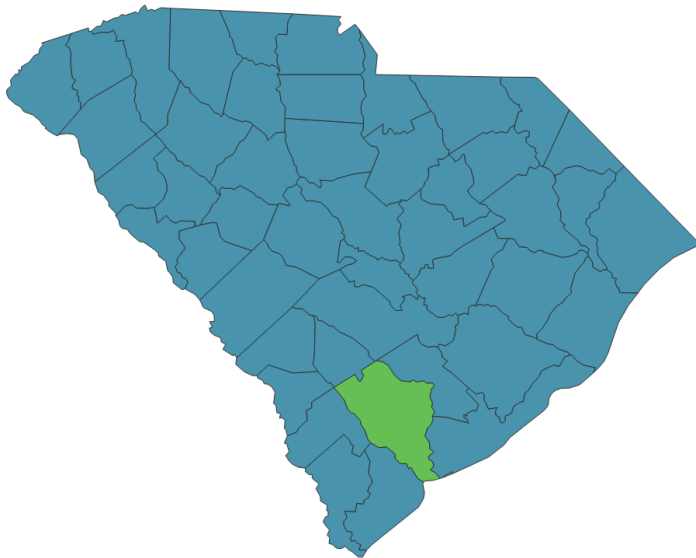


# Community Health Assessment: County Snapshot

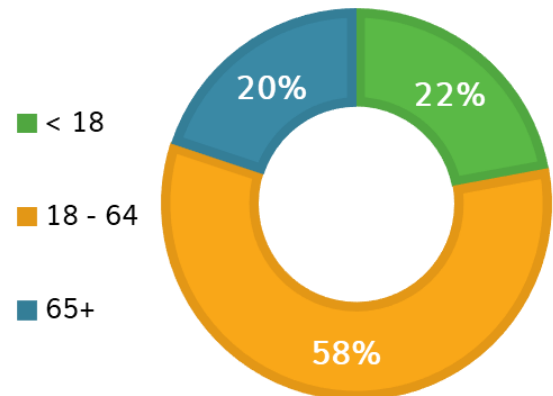
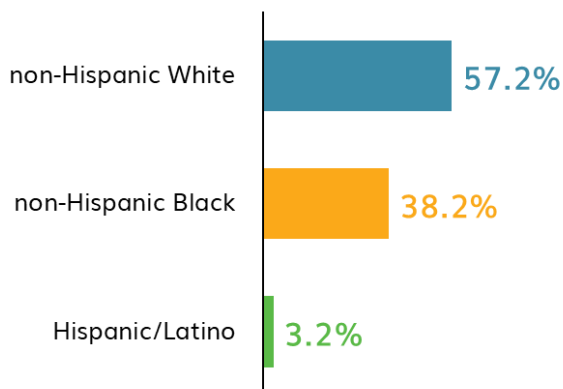


## Moving Toward a Healthier Colleton County

Based on the 2018 County Health Rankings, Colleton County is ranked **35th** out of 46 counties in South Carolina for health outcomes, which measures length and quality of life, and is ranked **38th** for health factors, which measures health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment.

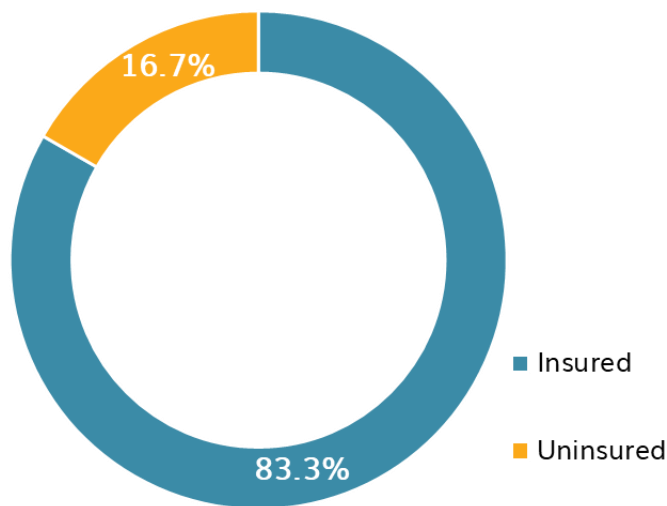

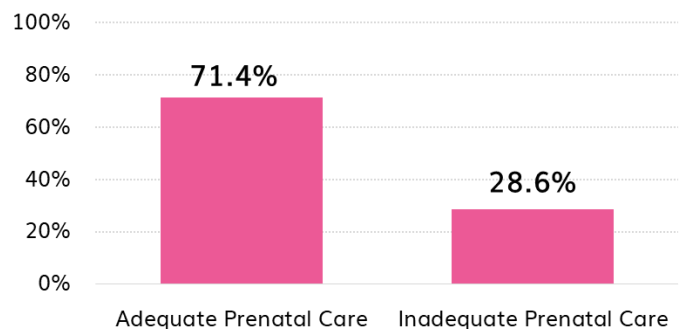

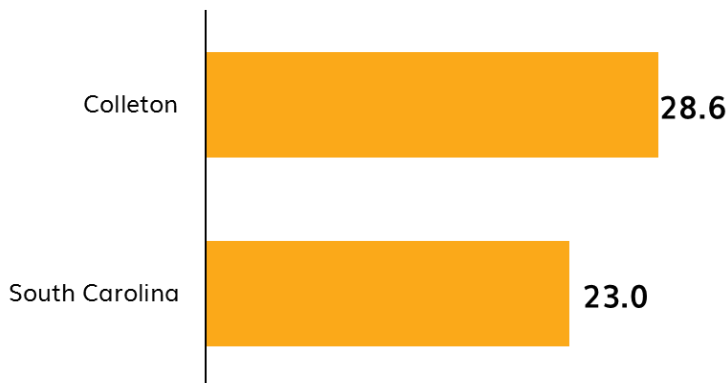

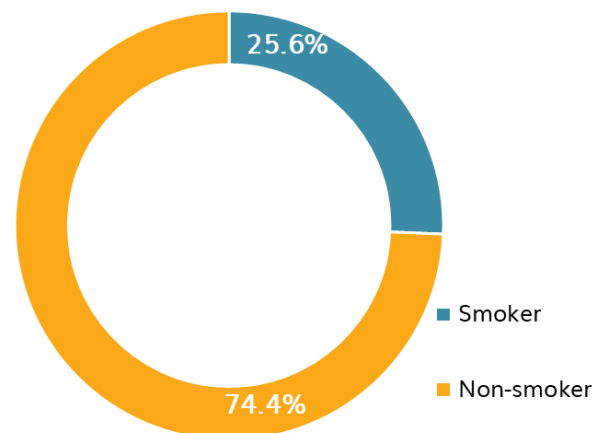

## Maternal and Infant Health

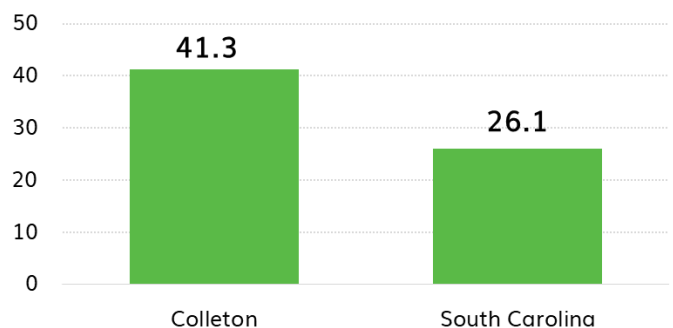


11.5% of babies were born at a low birthweight<sup>9</sup>

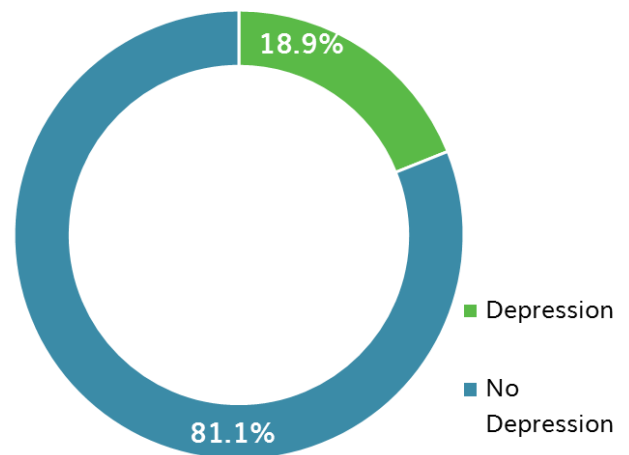

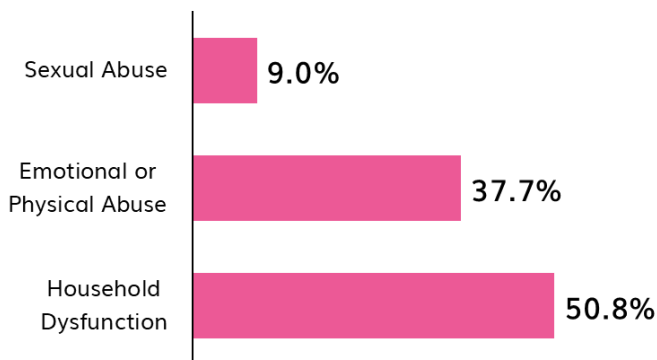
The 5-year drug overdose death rate is 14.9 deaths per 100,000 residents<sup>14</sup>
