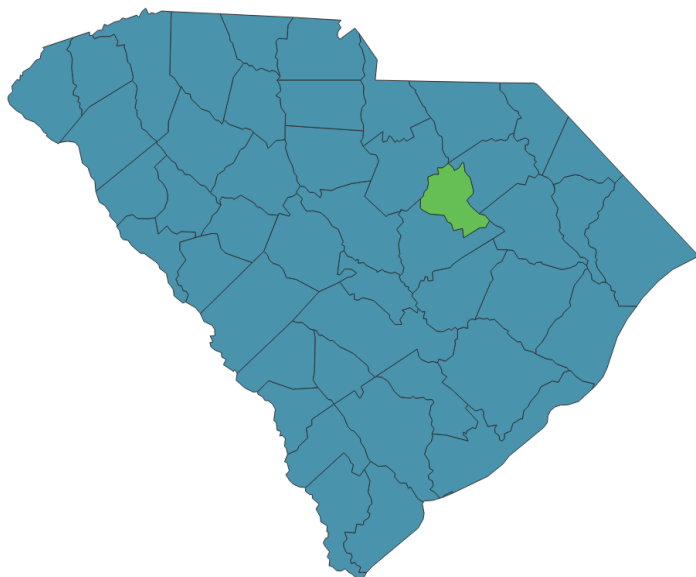


# Community Health Assessment: County Snapshot

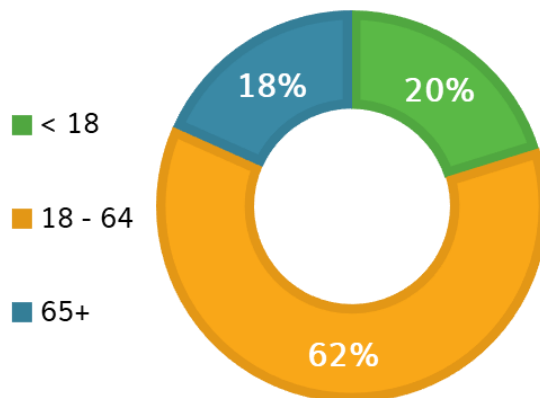
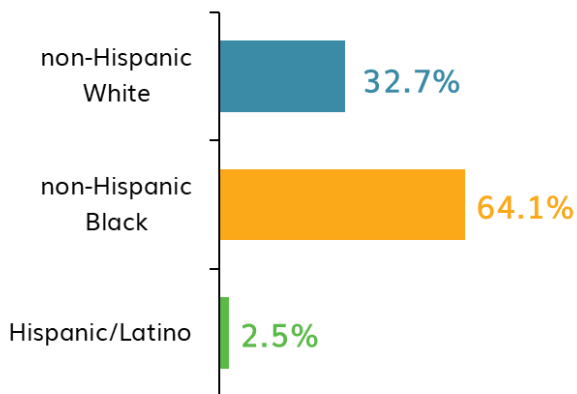


## Moving Toward a Healthier Lee County

Based on the 2019 County Health Rankings, Lee County is ranked **46th** out of 46 counties in South Carolina for health outcomes, which measures length and quality of life, and is ranked **43rd** for health factors, which measures health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment.

Population = 17,350 a 10.8% decrease from 2010<sup>1</sup>

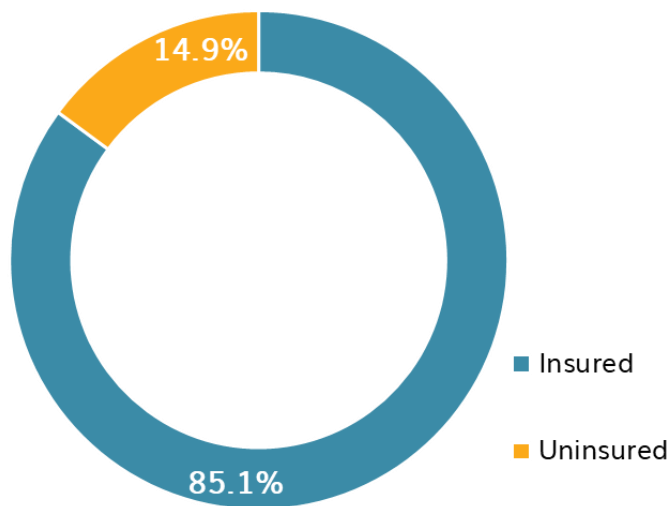

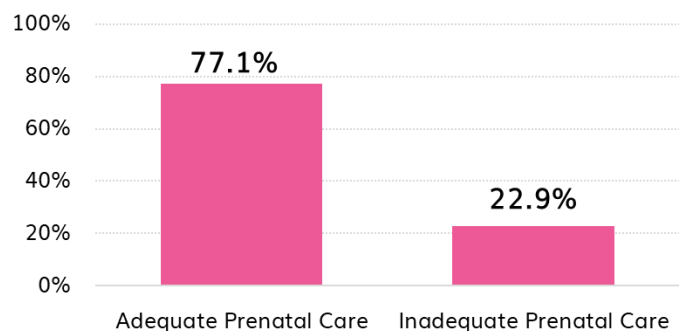

Prenatal Care, 2015-2017<sup>9</sup>

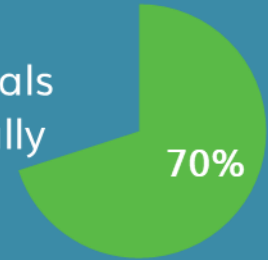


## Infectious Disease

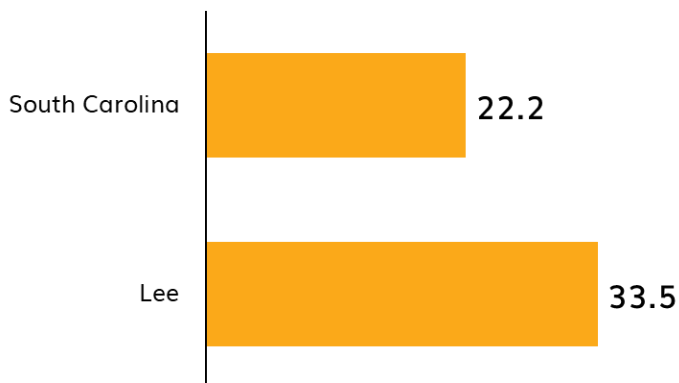

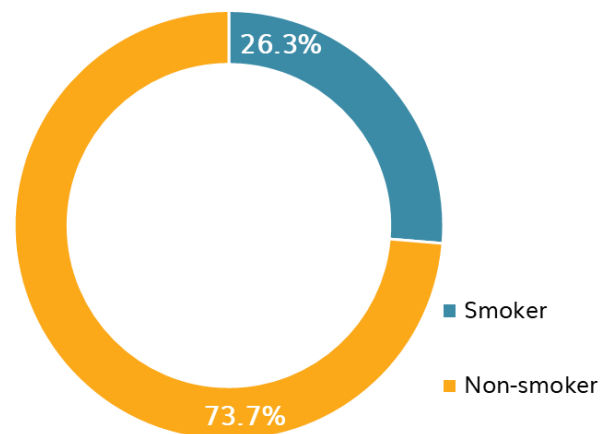

## Maternal and Infant Health

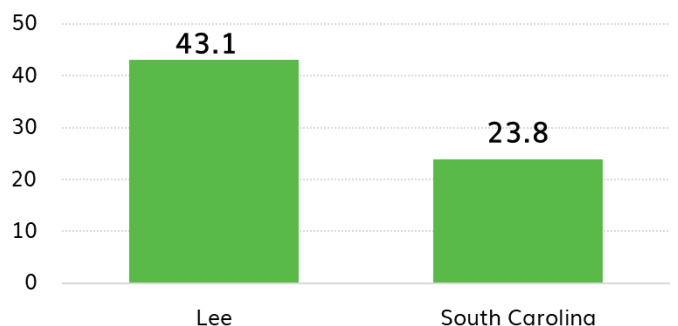


**13.3%** of babies were born at a low birthweight<sup>9</sup>

33.4 motor vehicle crash deaths per 100,000 residents<sup>14</sup>



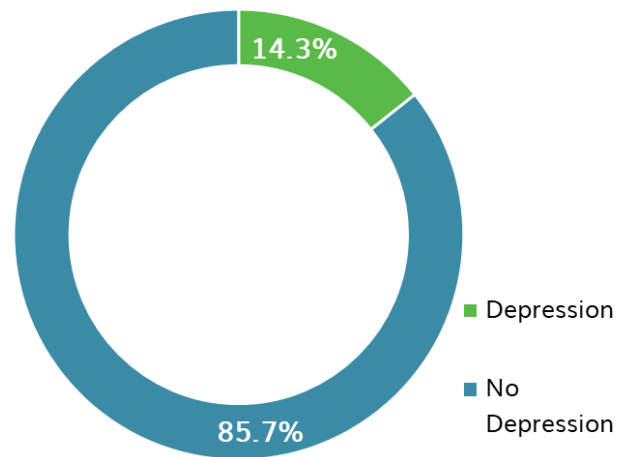
The 5-year injury death rate is 70.5 deaths per 100,000 residents<sup>1</sup>

13.9% of adults reported binge drinking<sup>7</sup>

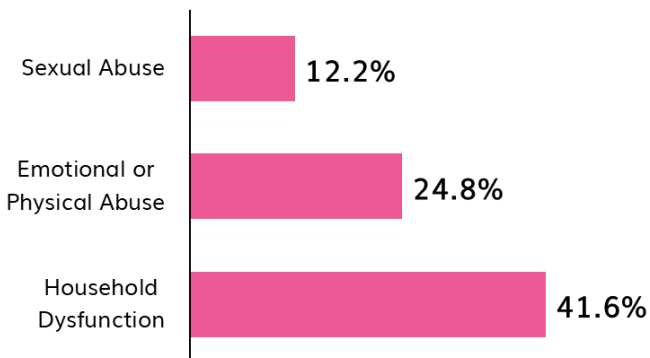
Depression Among Adults<sup>7</sup>
