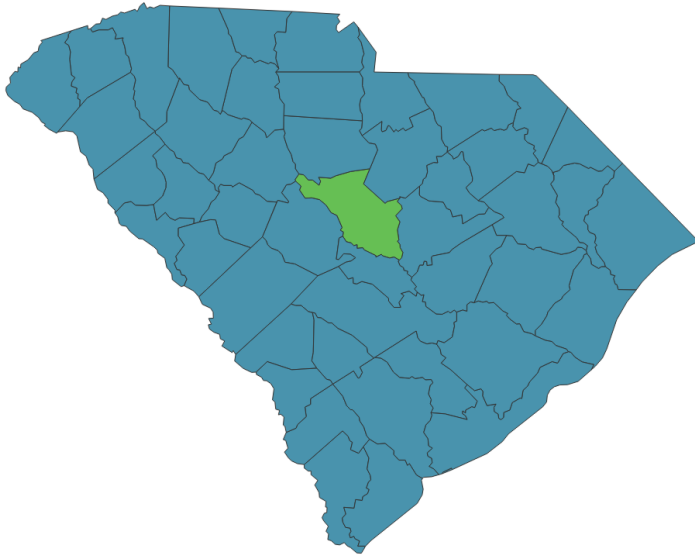

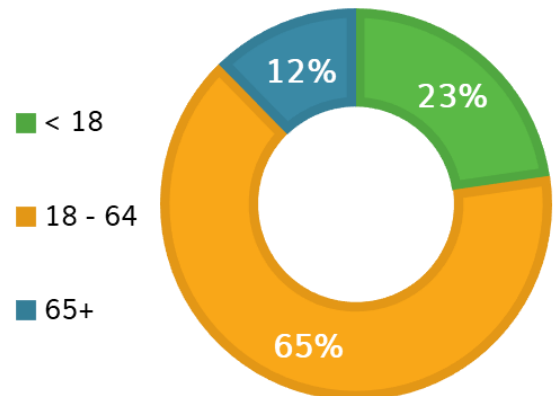
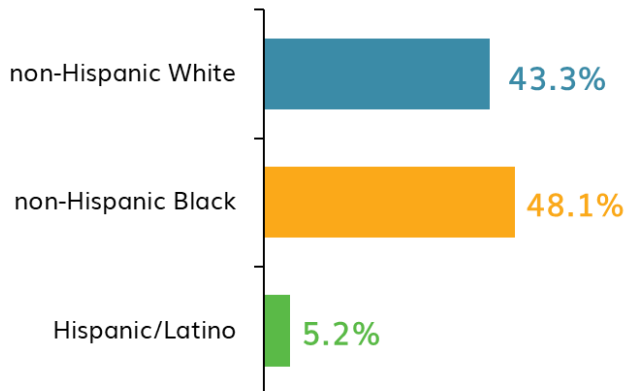


Moving Toward a Healthier Richland County

Based on the 2019 County Health Rankings, Richland County is ranked **12th** out of 46 counties in South Carolina for health outcomes, which measures length and quality of life, and is ranked **8th** for health factors, which measures health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment.

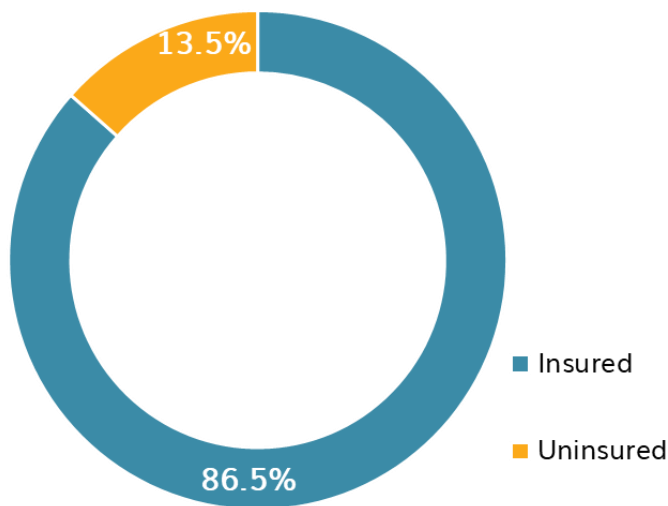

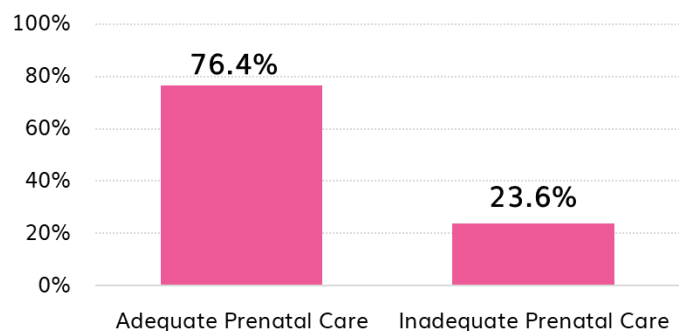

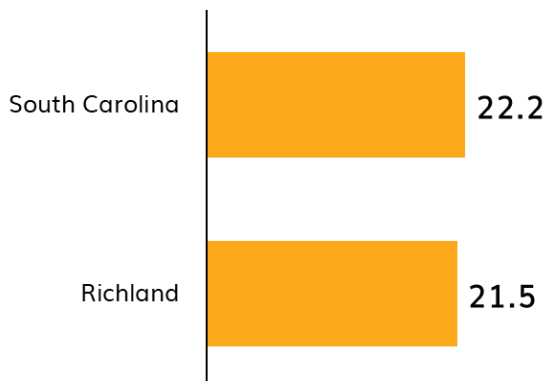

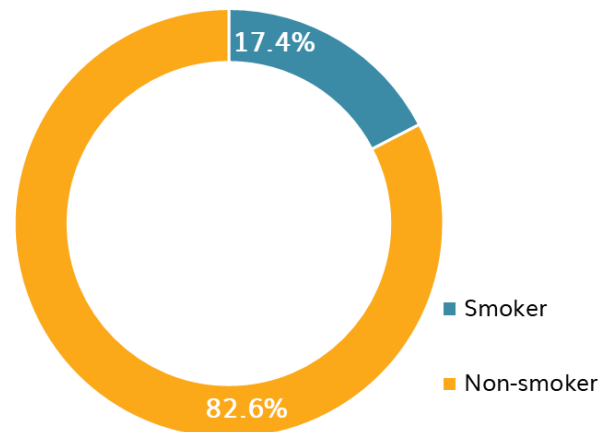

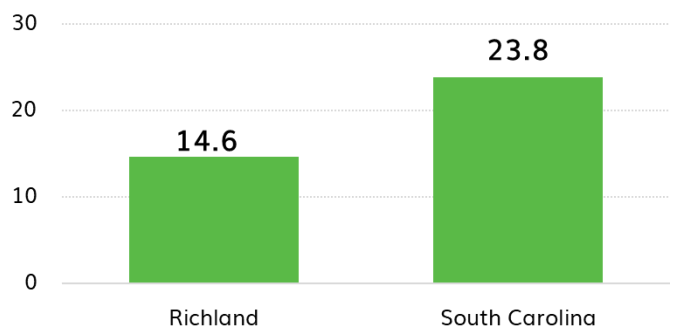

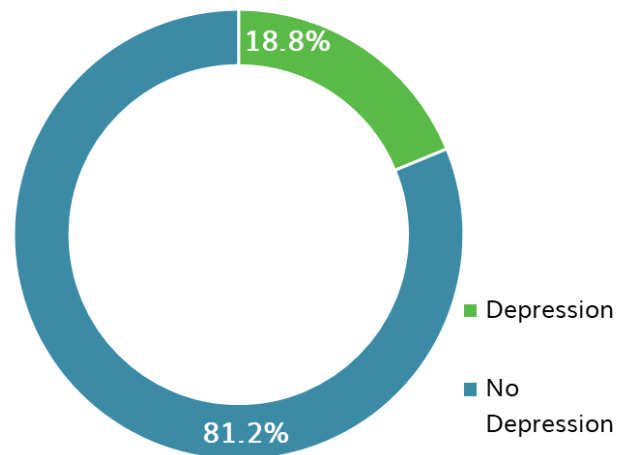

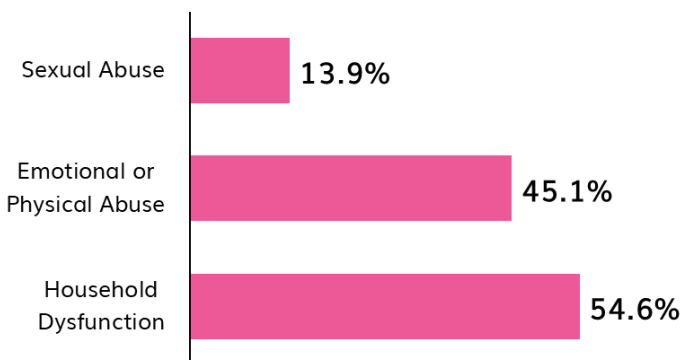
Depression Among Adults⁷
